STATEN ISLAND - Through January 12, 2003, more than thirty specially commissioned art installations and performances will unfold on the north shore of New York's Staten Island. Along a string of parks, museums, and historical sites between the Verrazana-Narrows and Bayonne Bridges—a shoreline graced with one of the most spectacular views of Manhattan-artists from around the world have created public artworks exploring the characteristics and histories of these distinctive waterfront locations. The Artfront/Waterfront initiative was organized by a coalition of international organizations that includes the Snug Harbor Cultural Center and the Council on the Arts and Humanities for Staten Island (New York), Vanguard Visions (New York/Stockholm), the Artists Project Ltd (Wales), and A Casa/At Home (Milan/Zagreb).
